





Bathing and Sleeping

Munich

This bathroom in Munich is separated by a jointless glass wall from the bedroom, so that both rooms are separate, yet connected at the same time. The room-high element between the bathroom and sleeping area can be used from both sides.

The complex bathroom technology remains invisible.

Both rooms have separate room climates to meet the different requirements of sleeping and showering. A room-high curtain that runs at a right angle can be used to eliminate the visual connection between the two rooms, while its soft fabric creates a quiet, intimate atmosphere in the bedroom.

The spatial layout and the style and surfaces of the furniture link the two rooms, giving them the cohesive look of a single unit.
